

Results of the Philadelphia

Municipal Primary Election on November 5, 1991

The official election turnout was 60.8%, with 484,575 voters participating out of 795,957 registered voters. Democrats had a 61.5% turnout, with 341,300 voters participating in the general election; Republicans had a 60.8% turnout, with 134,355 voters participating in the general election.
