BALLOT QUESTIONS

Statewide Joint Resolution No. 1

Shall the Pennsylvania Constitution be amended to disallow bail when proof is evident or presumption great that the accused committed an offense for which the maximum penalty is life imprisonment or that no conditions or combination of conditions other than imprisonment of the accused will reasonably assure the safety of any person and the community?

Philadelphia: Yes - 105,229; No - 98,011. Pennsylvania: Yes - 1,620,567; No - 601,463.

Statewide Joint Resolution No. 2

Shall the Pennsylvania Constitution be amended to provide that the Commonwealth shall have the same right to trial by jury in criminal cases as does the accused?

Philadelphia: Yes - 106,648; No - 94,710. Pennsylvania: Yes - 1,496,894; No - 684,204.

Philadelphia Ballot Question

Shall an electronic voting system be used at polling places in the City and County of Philadelphia?

Yes - 156,262; No - 44,882.
