Do you favor the incurring of indebtedness of up to \$100,000,000 for the purpose of establishing a program that utilizes capital and other related methods to enhance and improve the delivery of volunteer fire and volunteer emergency services in this Commonwealth as hereafter authorized by statute?

Vote: Yes - 151,580; PA - 1,833,795 or No - 66,191; PA - 691,319

Ballot Question (for Philadelphia voters only) (voters in other jurisdictions should check their local newspaper and the sample ballot at the polls to see if there are any ballot questions specific to their jurisdiction)

"Shall the Philadelphia Home Rule Charter be amended to provide for the creation, appointment, powers and duties of an independent Philadelphia Tax Reform Commission which would recommend methods to reduce the taxes of Philadelphia residents, workers and businesses in an equitable manner in order to enhance Philadelphia's ability to compete with other jurisdictions in attracting and retaining new residents, businesses and jobs, based upon the Commission's comprehensive analysis of taxation in Philadelphia?"

Vote: Yes - 169,649 or No - 43,157
